Workshop Details

This three-hour workshop is designed to assist grant applicants in developing a learning-focused, outcomes-based approach to its programs and capacity-building initiatives. It will include a presentation, discussion and hands-on activities to help grant applicants accurately and logically complete the foundation’s grant request workplan template. Participants will learn how to effectively use the workplan as a guide for decisionmaking, program management and evaluation.

Individual technical assistance will also be offered as part of the workshop. Organizations are required to bring one of the following: 1) a recent grant application to any funder; an application that will be submitted to the NPCHF by July 23rd; or a workplan developed for a current or planned program/service.

Jason Alexander, Principal and Co-Founder of Capacity for Change, will facilitate the workshop. Staff from the foundation will be on hand to assist Mr. Alexander in answering questions during the presentation.
